

REBEL FAMILIES MEETING MINUTES
FEBRUARY 3, 2015

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: 7:10PM
21 MEMBERS ATTENDED

PRINCIPALS REPORT: Principal Ward discussed the new Freshman Transition Program called "The Rebel Way" in which Juniors and Seniors will mentor Freshman. Also, starting next school year, the students will eat lunch by grade level.

Principal Ward is impressed with the Student Advisory Group's innovative and ingenious ideas. Student Council structure is one area they are working on in order to improve the fairness of the election process.

Twelve new courses are being offered next school year in the following subjects: Nursing, Business, Computer, College Prep and an expanded AP course selection. Scheduling will begin online next week, and by February 8th, the guidance department will start building the schedule.

SENIOR GOVERNMENT ADVISORS: The Prom theme this year is "Atlantis" and the colors are blue, gold and silver.

Fundraisers include the Prom Fashion Show on March 12th, a bake sale at Freshman orientation on February 19th, a Pizza Time fundraiser on February 11th, and bake sales during the drama productions on March 20th and 21st. Pizza Time is donating water for the bake sales.

PRESIDENTS REPORT: Julie Galicz discussed the importance of concessions sales for fundraising, and how, in the past, we have relied mostly on athletics to provide volunteer help with concessions. She wants to promote the fact that "Rebel Families" is an academic booster and plans to brainstorm ideas for getting the whole school involved with concessions.

Julie proposed that future Rebel Families meetings remain forward thinking and focus on the activities at hand, such as Prom Fashion Show, Prom, etc., and requests that past issues be saved for later discussion.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: Jeanette Nelson mentioned the volunteer hours sheets as a way of keeping track of involvement.
